





<u>Submission Deadlines:</u> community content is due on the 8th of the month for the following month's issue. Articles should be no more than 500 words in length.



# **Community Recognition for the Spy Hill Bottle Depot**

he Spy Hill Bottle Depot in Calgary was the Depot of choice for the most recent Applaud a Depot winner. Kim Hammond, a frequent customer, recently left some positive feedback for the team. She noted that "the people that work at the Spy Hill Bottle Depot are the [friendliest] group. They always greet you with a smile and are very pleasant. Just a great place!"

Kim is one of thousands of Albertans who have left Applauds for depots across the province which have provided excellent service to their customers. A draw is conducted from these entries every couple of months. The winning customer is awarded with a prize, while the corresponding Depot receives recognition for their community contributions.

On the afternoon of September 2nd, 2016, Depot staff were joined by Kim, Prasad Panda (MLA for Calgary-Foothills), and Jamie Kleinsteuber (MLA for Calgary-Northern Hills), as well as Gregory Hartzler (representing the City of Calgary), to celebrate the ongoing community contributions of the Depot. Alberta Bottle Depot Association President Trevor Nickel spoke to the environmental, economic, and community benefits of Depots, which are all demonstrated at the Spy Hill Bottle Depot.

Ronald McDonald House Charities Southern Alberta (RMHCSA) representatives Lisa Barrett and Janelle Mayo were on hand to highlight the impact of fundraising efforts from Depots. RMHCSA is one beneficiary of the Alberta Cans for Kids program administered by the Alberta Bottle Depot Association. The Spy Hill Bottle Depot has raised over \$16,000 for the Cans for Kids program since its inception. In the past year, over \$100,000 in bottle drives and fundraisers were processed at this Depot location as well.

Kleinsteuber spoke to the effectiveness of the Alberta beverage container collection system, with recent return rates in the

province now in excess of 85%. Over 2 billion refundable beverage containers were returned to Depots in Alberta last year.





challenges we face in both our city and province, as
Calgarians, we still have much to be grateful for.

This year's construction season is wrapping up. Despite the many delays caused by our wet summer, many infrastructure enhancements and community improvements were completed throughout the communities in Ward 2. Some of these improvements include:

- Stoney Trail / Sarcee Trail NW Interchange upgrade to be completed by year end.
- Twinning of 112 Ave west of Sarcee Trail NW to be completed by year end.
- Crowfoot Way NW Enhanced Crosswalk Markings & Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB).

- RRFB for Crosswalk at Arbour Lake Road NW & Arbour Crest Drive NW.
- Re-development of the pathway under Symons Valley Parkway NW.
- New pathway at Robert Thirsk High School.

For Sage Hill and area transit riders Route 429 has been extended from the current terminus in Sherwood to the Sage Hill transit hub just north of the Sage Hill Walmart. This change will provide a new connection from the Sage Hill and Kincora area to the northwest LRT, as well as provide connections to Route 425 and the north central area of the city. It will also help connect the newly emerging shopping centre to surrounding communities.

### **Maple Sausage Brunch Bites**

If you're a little bored with the typical breakfast food and looking for something different, try these Maple Sausage Brunch Bites. They won the grand prize in the 2014 Johnsonville sausage recipe competition. They are easy, quick, and freeze well. They are also great for 'on the go'. Reheat for a quick workday breakfast and cook in aluminum lined muffin cups for easy clean up. You can

use the shredded or cubed hash browns (though the shredded tend to hold together better). Or serve them with fruit and you have yourself a perfect brunch.

### Ingredients:

- 5 Eggs
- 3 Tbsp. Butter
- I/3 Cup Light Sour Cream
- 4 Cups Frozen Hash Browns, Defrosted
- I I/2 Cups Light (Old/Sharp) Cheddar Cheese, Grated
- 1/3 Cup Canned Low-Fat Cream of Mushroom Soup
- I/2 Cup Finely Chopped Onion (Approximately I Small Onion)
- I Pkg (375 g) Johnsonville Maple Syrup Flavoured Sausages, Cooked and Cut into 1/4 Inch Pieces

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Cook sausages according to package instructions.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray 12 muffin cups thoroughly with non-stick cooking spray.
- 3. Chop cooked sausage links into ¼ inch circles.
- 4. Cook onion in butter for 2 minutes on high in microwave.

- 5. In a large mixing bowl, combine the defrosted hash browns, onion cooked in butter, mushroom soup, sour cream, eggs, grated cheddar cheese and sausages.
- 6. Scoop mixture into muffin tins to the top and pack down tightly with spatula (ensure they are packed to the top to make for easier removal).
- 7. Bake for 20-30 minutes in pre-heated oven.
- 8. \*These next 2 steps are important to follow exactly: Remove from oven, let cool for about 3-5 minutes, then run a butter knife around the edge of each muffin cup to loosen the Maple Sausage Brunch Bites.
- 9. Let cool a full 10 minutes, run knife around edges once more, then carefully remove with a spatula and place on plates.
- 10. Serve immediately topped with salsa garnish and with fruit/fruit salad (optional).

\*Optional: Garnish with 2 tsp. salsa

Serve with fruit Yields: 12 servings

Preparation time: 15 minutes Bake/cook time: 20-30 minutes

### HAVE A SAFE HALLOWEEN!

elcome to the month of October, and the scariest day of the year! Halloween is a fun day for kids of all ages, but it can pose some potential hazards. The Calgary Police Service has the following tips for parents, drivers and homeowners on how to make Halloween safe and fun for everyone.

### Halloween tips for trick-or-treaters and their parents

- Regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks or well-lit corners only.
- Parents should also remind children to stay on the sidewalk and only cross the street at intersections.
- Children should be encouraged not to take shortcuts through alleys and abandoned areas, and to stay in populated, well-lit areas. It's a good idea for kids to carry a flashlight and to have a cell phone.
- A bright costume with reflector tape will make children more visible to drivers.
- Costumes should not be highly flammable, nor interfere with easy walking.
- If children are wearing masks, the masks shouldn't

### Halloween tips for drivers

- When children get excited, they tend to forget the most basic safety rules, especially around traffic. If you're driving, slow down and be extra cautious in residential areas.
- Drive defensively expect children to dart out from between parked cars.
- Watch carefully for people using pedestrian crossings.

### Halloween tips for homeowners

- Turn on your porch light to let children know they're welcome (or vice versa).
- Remove obstacles such as lawn ornaments and gardening tools from yards.
- Place decorations out of the way so that nobody trips.
