



## **Enthusiastic crowd at school opening**

What is official opening event this past February. RRROCA was invited to attend, and we are so glad we did! The event was very well organized and the enthusiasm of the students was infectious.

The school is named after

Calgary's William Donald Pratt, famously known as Bill. His family attended the ceremony. William D. Pratt's grandson, T.O. Whenham, gave a speech on behalf of the Pratt family about how proud Bill would have been of the school. Whenham was especially

proud of the fact that the school could open in September against all time constraints, because this mirrored most of Bill's projects during his life. He concluded his speech by throwing a white hat into the crowd, just like his grandpa would have done. The school was presented with a special gift of a historically significant school bell by the Calgary Board of Education (CBE). This bell was originally from the first school built in Calgary (in 1885), which was located under the Calgary Tower. One thing that was clear during the ceremony was the brilliance of the students in all faculties, from the concert band's performance to the dramatic presentation on Bill's life by the performing arts class. We as a community are extremely fortunate to have such an amazing school in our neighbourhood. You can tell that the staff are very hardworking and the student love being there. It all started four years ago, when some Royal Oak/Rocky Ridge residents went to Sandra Jansen and Joy Bowen to demand a middle school for the community. The perseverance of all involved resulted in this amazing school that now stands in our community.

## **Auto Glass Basics**

## Types of Auto Glass By Durotolu Aro, RRROCA Director of Transportation

Laminated glass is made by sandwiching a layer of plastic between two sheets of glass; these three layers are then fused together via exposure to high temperature and pressure. The plastic holds the glass in place if it breaks, creating the spider's web look. This eliminates the risk of passenger injury due to flying glass. Some manufacturers use UV ray absorbing plastic to protect the passengers from sun rays. Laminated glass is used for the windshield; some luxury car

manufacturers use it for the front side windows as well.





Laminated Windshield Glass

Tempered Rear Window Glass

Tempered glass is made by rapidly heating and cooling glass to make it hard but brittle. Tempered glass breaks by shattering into millions of tiny pieces with edges too dull to cut; as a result, passengers are protected from glass cuts. Tempered glass is usually used for rear and side windows. If trapped in a vehicle and you need to break a window, try the sides first; you will need less force to break those.

**Chinook Winds and Chipped Windshields:** The City of Calgary applies salt and small rocks to the road to aid driving in snowy conditions. With time, the rocks bind to the snow and get pushed to the side. Chinook winds warm up our winter and melt some of the snow, leaving behind the rocks. We know the rest of the story. Chinook winds are one of the reasons Calgary has a high percentage of chipped windshields.

**Crack Propagation:** On cold winter mornings, the windshield contracts and then gradually expands as the windshield heater warms it. The temperature difference causes stresses in the windshield, which can result in chip and crack propagation. Chips and cracks located around the lower middle section of the windshield are more susceptible to propagating because most of the hot air form the windshield heater is directed at that area. This is why a large percentage of long cracks are located at the lower section of the windshield. For this reason, chips and cracks in this area should be fixed as soon as possible.

**Glass Care:** Auto glass cleaner/polish leave a thin film on the windshield that repels water, thereby preventing water streaks in rainy weather. The coat also increases the windshield wiper's efficiency. Medically Supervised Weight Loss

## Spring Yard Waste landfill drop-off program

## Bring your yard waste to City landfills for free composting from April 7 - May 28.

What's old is new again when composting your yard waste. From April 7 – May 28, all three City landfills will waive fees for residential spring yard waste. Bring your leaves, branches, plants (no sod – it can't be composted) and other yard waste to any City landfill for free composting.

Please use paper yard waste bags, leave the material loose or bring it in plastic bags (plastic bags must be emptied onsite). This program is only for residential customers and charges will apply if your load contains other items.

By composting your yard waste, this material is kept out of the landfill and given a second life as compost.

Free mulch is available for pick up at all City landfills for both residents and businesses. Bring your shovels as you are required to load your own vehicle.

Please note that landfill hours have changed! Check the days/hours of your nearest landfill and other program details at calgary.ca/yardwaste.

## Green carts coming mid-2017



Il single-family homes and fourplexes can expect to receive their new green carts in mid-2017. Green carts and starter kits will be delivered to homes quadrant by quadrant. Weekly green cart collection will start the same week for the entire quadrant. Details on quadrant start dates will be shared by the City later this spring.

### Residents will receive a starter kit which includes:

- Green cart the same size as the blue cart;
- Kitchen pail to collect food scraps inside the home;
- Starter supply of compostable bags to line the kitchen pail;
- Starter supply of paper yard waste bags for extra yard waste that doesn't fit inside the cart; and
- Instruction guide and collection schedule.

Green carts and blue carts will be picked up every week on the same day. Since most household waste is compostable and may smell, this material will be picked up once a week. Black carts will be picked up once every two weeks on a different day than blue and green carts since more than half of our garbage is compostable material that can go in your green cart. To learn how to prevent odours and pests, visit Green Cart Tips at www.calgary.ca.

Eligible homes cannot opt out of the program. If you live in apartment or condo, find out about food and yard waste diversion requirements for multi-family complexes at www.calgary.ca.



# **BICYCLE HELMET SAFETY**

Head injuries are a leading cause of serious injury and death to children riding bicycles\*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember – it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

### **GETTING INFORMED**

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

### **GETTING STARTED**

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling.

### **GETTING THE RIGHT FIT**

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.
