



Slow Cooker Pulled Pork on a Bun

recently read in Ricardo Magazine that Albertans love their slow cookers. We love them so much so that we use it more than any other province in Canada. Of course we do! What's not to love about an appliance that does all our cooking for us while we're at work or off gallivanting around?! This slow cooker pulled pork recipe is perfect for any time

of the year, makes a great weeknight or Sunday night dinner and is perfect for feeding a crowd. So pile it high on buns with a quick broccoli slaw, garnish it with some pickled jalapenos or sliced peperoncini for even more zing (if that's your thing) and enjoy having the slow cooker do your work for you!

Prep times: 30 minutes Cook time: 8 minutes Servings: 8

Ingredients:

3-1/2 lb. (1.6 kg) pork shoulder blade roast

I/2 tsp. (2 mL) salt

I/2 tsp. (2 mL) pepper

2 Tbsp. (30 mL) vegetable oil

I onion, diced

4 cloves garlic, minced

2 Tbsp. (30 mL) chili powder

2 tsp. (10 mL) dried cilantro

2 bay leaves

I/4 cup (60 mL) tomato paste

I can (14 oz/398 mL) tomato sauce

2 Tbsp. (30 mL) packed brown sugar

2 Tbsp. (30 mL) cider vinegar

2 Tbsp. (30 mL) Worcestershire sauce

I Tbsp. natural hickory liquid smoke flavour

340 g/12 oz. broccoli cole slaw

4-6 Tbsp. of coleslaw dressing (add to your liking)

1/2 cup sliced peperoncini or pickled jalapenos (optional)

8 whole wheat buns



Directions:

- Sprinkle pork with salt and pepper. In Dutch oven or large, deep frying pan, heat oil over medium-high heat; brown pork all over. Transfer to slow cooker.
- 2. Add onions, garlic, chili powder, cilantro and bay leaves to Dutch oven/frying pan; cook, stirring often, until onions are softened, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Add tomato paste; cook, stirring, about 2 minutes. Add tomato sauce, sugar, vinegar and Worcestershire sauce and liquid smoke. Pour into slow cooker. Cover and cook on low until pork is tender, about 8 hours.
- 4. Transfer pork to cutting board and when cooled for about 10 minutes, remove any fat and bone. With 2 forks, shred or "pull" pork.
- 5. Meanwhile, pour liquid from slow cooker into large saucepan; skim off fat. Bring to boil over high heat; boil vigorously until reduced to 3 cups, 10 to 12 minutes. Discard bay leaves.
- 6. Add pulled pork; stir to coat and warm through.
- 7. Pile meat on bun.
- 8. Broccoli slaw: Mix broccoli slaw and coleslaw salad dressing together and add to bun.
- 9. Add peperoncini or pickled jalapenos, if desired.

Please note that there is a chance that some items may get changed, postponed or removed due to circumstances outside Ward 1's jurisdiction.

- Creation of a residential parking zone West of 85th Street is being considered;
- Notices about the parking situation are being prepared for delivery to stakeholders in households close to the Park, and planned to be delivered in January 2017;
- A stakeholders' meeting is planned to be held by Roads for those households receiving said notices;
- Creating additional parking spots on the North side of the river by Baker Park is currently being considered;
- The creation of a corresponding shuttle service to tie in Baker parking with Bowness Park usage is being planned;
- It is being proposed that large party bookings be obliged to use Baker Park parking and shuttle services:
- Electronic traffic counters to monitor the number of vehicles entering Bowness Park are being looked at;
- The use of electronic signage at the gate and on the main road(s) outside of the Park to better advise users of the availability of parking spots is being explored; and
- Better provisions for "drop-off service" for seniors, handicapped persons, etc. being pursued.

On January 23, City Council approved \$45 million in tax relief by limiting the 2017 non-residential municipal property tax increase to 5 percent. The civic census online will be open on April I for census submissions. In addition, this year, Calgarians will also be able to complete their voter registration online.


