Transportation Safety in Rocky Ridge/Royal Oak

he new school year just started and I think this is the best time to remind ourselves of transportation safety around schools and in our community in general. The main complaint we got last year was about parents using private driveways around our schools for turning around. Here are a few reminders:

Playground Zone Safety

- It is illegal to make a U-turn in a playground zone.
- It is illegal to pass (overtake) a car in a playground zone.
- Playground zones must be observed year-round.
- When a pedestrian light in a playground zone is flashing after playground hours, all vehicles must observe the playground zone speed limit (30km/hr).

Community Safety

 U-turns are not permitted at intersections with traffic lights, except when a separate sign indicates U-turns are allowed. In Rocky Ridge/Royal Oak, U-turns are not permitted at any of the traffic lights in or at the entrances to the community.

- Pedestrians have the right of way at every intersection (with or without a marked crosswalk) in our community.
 Pedestrians should wave to indicate their intention to cross a street.
- Pedestrians crossing the road at any point apart from an intersection or marked crosswalk do not have the right of way and must yield to motorists.
- Legal U-turns can only be made at an intersection that is not in a school zone.
- The maximum speed limit on all roads in the community is 50km/hr except where indicated (e.g., Rocky Ridge road is 60km/hr).
- On a two-lane road you may pass another vehicle on the right if that vehicle is waiting to make a left turn.
- Cyclists who are biking on the road are considered motorists and must obey all traffic rules (stop for pedestrians, stop at stop signs/red lights, yield to vehicles, etc.).
- Bicycles must be equipped with a bell.



RRROCA Parks

Community Park Update

reating a new park in the City of Calgary is a long and challenging process. RRROCA's community park was first proposed in 2010; at that time, a hockey rink was the sole amenity. After consultations with residents and feedback that our community was deficient in family neighbourhood parks, the vision grew to include a community hub, a social

space, and multi-generational amenities.

The new and improved vision was designed by professional landscape architects and engineers. Our permit was released in the Fall of 2016 and work commenced in late October, with the intention that the park would be completed in at least two phases, depending on funding. RRROCA has been putting aside funds raised through our volunteer events at the casino for many years, specifically for the park. Our funds plus provincial and local funding allowed us to construct the infrastructure, basic site servicing, and the hockey rink. Almost 60% of the park's full build-out was completed in the Fall of 2016. Community residents were getting excited to finally see something happening.

Additional finishing work was completed in the spring of this year, after which the construction fence came down. We have been so pleased to see families coming to enjoy the pathways, picnic tables, and open play areas. The rink is used frequently for roller hockey, basketball, and lacrosse. We have been able to achieve our goal of creating a family friend place for our residents to enjoy all year round thanks to the numerous grants we received from generous contributors.
