

WORLD CLASS TENNIS CENTRE COMING TO CALGARY IN THE SPRING OF 2016

A new state-of-the-art tennis centre is coming to the Acadia neighborhood in southeast Calgary. Located just off of McLeod Trail (two blocks east of the Carriage House Inn on 90th Ave. S.E in Acadia) the non-profit tennis centre will open in the spring of 2016 and will welcome the local community with year-round access to tennis. With 8 world-class indoor tennis courts, 5 outdoor courts, viewing areas for each court, a fitness centre, food services area and administrative offices for Tennis Alberta and Tennis Canada, the centre will become the heart of Calgary's growing tennis community, redefining the standard for major tennis centres across Canada. As a non-profit tennis centre, all profits generated will be re-invested and focused on youth tennis development programs in Alberta.



SLOW DOWN AND ENJOY MORE!



If you share the Scout Motto "Do Your Best," the local Cubs and Beavers need your help.







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Pet Safety - Keep Your Pets Indoors This Winter

Humans are not the only ones who need to keep warm during the winter months. Your pets do too. Although they might be covered in fur, your pet can still fall ill during the colder months or even get frostbite when temperatures drop below freezing. But have no fear, here are a few tips on how to keep your pet warm this winter.

Keep your pet indoors. This is the number one way to keep your pets safe and warm in the winter. For dogs, take shorter walks when the weather is severely cold. A good rule of thumb is to go out with them and when you're ready to come in, chances are your dog is too. If your dog must stay outside, make sure she has proper shelter and a source of fresh water at all times, and make sure her water cannot freeze.

It's important to remember that cold cars can pose a significant risk to your pet's health. Leaving your cat or dog in the car is just as dangerous in winter as in the summer. Limit car travel to only that which is necessary, and don't leave your pet unattended in the vehicle.

If you lose your pet during the winter months, do not delay. Call 3-1-1 to see if Animal Services has picked up your pet. If not, file a lost pet report with Animal Services.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy New Year. Every New Year, many of us make resolutions for better heath, more exercise, or being kinder to others around us. City Council has asked for a new bylaw to be developed and brought back to Council by February 22, 2016. This time-frame allows for The City to work through the details of the new bylaw with stakeholders including Uber. While it is important that we have more choice and competition amongst TNCs, it is also important that the new bylaws are developed correctly so that they provide adequate safety and security for both drivers and passengers of TNCs.

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


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
