



2017 Spring Sports Program

REGISTRATION

Registration for the 2017 Spring Sports Program starts on February 1, 2017 and closes on March 12, 2017. Registration is available online only and a link can be found on the Rocky Ridge Royal Oak Community Association website (RRROCA.org), under Sports.

Register early to avoid disappointment. If you have not registered for any programs with RRROCA in 2015 and/or 2016, you will need to set up a new account.

RRROCA Programs are available for registration to those who have a RRROCA membership. If you do not have a RRROCA membership, the membership fee will be automatically applied during the registration process. Memberships are \$30 annually per household. Registration is open to non-residents as well, if a RRROCA membership is purchased.

SCHEDULE

2017 programs run for eight weeks, beginning on Saturday, April 22 and end on Monday, June 19. Only players born before March 31, 2014 are eligible to register.

VOLUNTEER

Our program would not be able to run without volunteers. Parents who volunteer within our Spring Sports Program will receive a registration fee refund of \$50 for each volunteer commitment fulfilled. Please note that this comes to a maximum of \$50 per volunteer commitment, per registration, per child.

There are a few key volunteer positions that we would like to have in place before registration begins. By contacting us now to volunteer, you can guarantee your child's spot in the program, and ensure that you get the volunteer position of your choice! We are currently recruiting for the following positions: Age Group Coordinators, Coach Coordinator, Equipment Manager, and Volunteer Coordinator. 





Community Park Construction

ou may have noticed that construction of our Community Park is now in progress. We are very excited about the progress that

has been made so far. At time of writing this article, the rink surface is complete, basketball backstops have been installed, the base for the shed has been poured, and the parking lot base is underway. We anticipate completion of the park in early 2017, but this deadline is weather dependent. Underground utilities are nearing completion. We are pushing for ENMAX to complete the electrical service; this is required to operate the rink watering and lighting.

The plan for the community park includes year-round family use and multigenerational facilities. Phase I of the project includes servicing, the hockey rink,



and the storage shed. Phase 2 upgrades will be scheduled for completion through 2017/2018, depending on grant funding applications.

Butter Tarts By Terri Gilson, Rocky Ridge Resident and Volunteer Contributor



Just in time for holiday baking! Butter tarts are quintessentially Canadian and the perfect addition to your Christmas baking tray. This recipe is my family's favourite and receives rave reviews every time I serve it. You can substitute pecans for the raisins, if desired. Enjoy!

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F.
- Mix ingredients in large bowl, in order given (butter, brown sugar, eggs, cream) then add vinegar last.
- Place a few raisins or chopped pecans in unbaked tarts shells
- 4. Pour filling in to 3/4 full.
- 5. Bake for 12-14 minutes.
- 6. Cool until set.

Yield: 18

Ingredients:

- 2 Tbsps. butter, melted
- I cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- ¼ cup cream
- I tsp vinegar
- About ½ cup raisins (or substitute finely chopped pecans)
- 18 tart shells

his holiday season, let's take time out of our busy schedule to assist those of us who are less fortunate in our community. Many of our city food banks and charities have seen demand for their services increase dramatically over the last year. Let's ensure Calgary remains Canada's most generous city by supporting the many important charitable organizations in our city.

Another way to support our neighbours is to become a snow angel. Keeping sidewalks free of ice and snow can be very challenging for older adults and people with limited mobility. JOE'S HOLIDAY EGGNOG

Ingredients:

- 4 eggs
- 120 ml sugar
- 500 ml of milk
- ½ tsp of vanilla
- I tsp. rum flavouring
- May add optional pinch of nutmeg and cinnamon

Directions

- I. Put the milk, vanilla, and optional cinnamon and nutmeg in a saucepan, and heat on low setting until mixture is brought to a boil.
- 2. Combine egg yolks and sugar and thoroughly blend together.
- 3. Pour the ingredients from Step 2 into the saucepan with the mixture from Step 1. Cook over medium heat, stir in rum flavouring and stir mixture until it reaches desired thickness (3-5 minutes).
- 4.Refrigerate until cool.





Winter, All-Weather, or All-Season Tires

What makes them different?

I. Material: Tires are made of natural and synthetic rubber, silica, metal and a host of other materials. Winter tires contain a higher percentage of natural rubber and silica which help keep the tires soft in freezing temperatures. Think of a gecko's soft feet gripping on to smooth glass. All-season tires

(sometimes called summer tires) contain a higher percentage of synthetic rubber, so they tend to harden in freezing temperature resulting in reduced breaking power and steering control. Temperature, not snow, is the limiting factor when it comes to material.

2. Thread Profile: Winter tires have more complex, aggressive thread patterns which help grip on to roads in the winter, and prevent snow build up on the tire. Snow or ice is compressed as a tire moves over it, causing it to melt slightly (like when skating). The grooves help channel out the water from under the tire, thus preventing hydroplaning and improving grip. If the water is not channeled out by the grooves the tire will slide over ice, much like an ice skate.

Below 7°C, winter tires outperform all season tires, even when there is no snow on the road. In summer all-season tires outperform winter tires and do not wear as quickly. All-weather tires can be thought of as a hybrid between the two.







Tire Markings:

M+S: (Mud & Snow) compared to a "normal" tires, these tires provide improved driving in snow

and ice. Winter, all weather and all season (summer) tires carry this marking.

The 3 peaked mountain: The snow/freezing weather performance of the tire have been validated by standardized lab test. Winter and all weather tires carry this marking. There are no markings that differentiate between winter and all weather tires; you just have to rely on the sales person.

Note:

- Different tire types have different breaking and steering control capacities; for this reason, mixing tire types is a bad idea.
- In Quebec, winter tires are mandatory on all vehicles between December 15 and March 15. After the implementation of this law, there was a 17% drop in winter collisions, and a 36% drop in related serious injuries or deaths.
- With dozens of models with overlapping characteristics, and varying driving conditions (plowed, unplowed, high gradient, city or back country roads), you need a personalized solution. Two common choices are: install allweather tires year-round, or install winter tires in winter, and all-season tires during the rest of the year.
