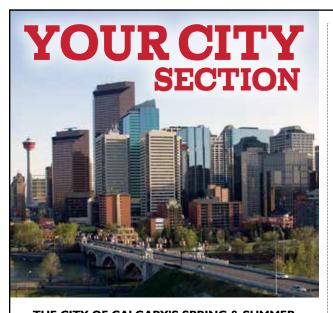

he City of Calgary has been working hard to deliver value for citizens. Although the current economic downturn has been difficult, the City continues to be financially stable and fiscally responsible. City Manager Jeff Fielding has led the way by reducing the operating budget by over \$409 M, a decrease of 20%.

I think it's a great disservice when individuals within Council and some media sources report that the City continually spends and doesn't react to the economic downtown. This is a myth. I find it disappointing when inaccurate information is presented to Calgarians.

The 2017 Corporate Annual Report shows how the City delivered value for citizens by quickly switching its focus from accommodating rapid growth to supporting the economy, keeping Calgarians working, and reducing the cost of local government, by:

- Managing our costs and making our organization as efficient as possible
- Strategically managing our infrastructure projects and investments
- Ensuring we provide services that are of value to citizens and collectively strive to make life better every day for Calgarians.

Despite the changing economic environment, the City's 2017 consolidated financial statements continued to reflect a strong financial picture of a municipality investing in infrastructure to facilitate economic growth, stimulate job creation, prepare for growth and build a more resilient city.

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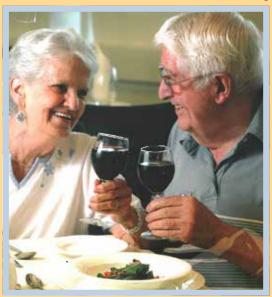

BBQ Beer Can Chicken

For reasons I cannot explain, sticking half a can of beer up the butt of a chicken makes it super tender, juicy, and totally awesome! This Beer Can Chicken with Molasses Beer

BBQ Sauce is the perfect
Father's Day meal.

Pair this moist and juicy chicken with a

bold and tangy Molasses Beer BBQ sauce, that has 45 glorious minutes to work its magic, and the result is pure delicious!

This recipe is delicious, healthy, and Weight Watchers friendly too, as all the fat drips off the chicken into the pan. I actually got the original recipe out of my Weight Watchers magazine back in 2003, as Beer Can Chicken was very popular around that time. I haven't seen it for a while, so I decided to resurrect it. Trust me, you (and Dad) will be glad I did. So, if you are looking for easy and healthy BBQ/grilling recipes for Father's Day, try this one!

Course: main
Cuisine: North American
Cook Time: I hour 30 minutes
Total Time: I hour 40 minutes

Prep Time: 10 minutes **Servings:** 6 people

Adapted from Weight Watchers Magazine, 2003

Ingredients

- I can beer (I use light beer)
- I roaster chicken
- Molasses & Beer BQQ sauce (see recipe below)

Molasses & Beer BBQ sauce:

- 1 1/4 cup chili sauce (I use Heinz brand)
- 3/4 cup molasses
- 3/4 cup light beer
- 2 tbsp Dijon mustard
- I tbsp chili powder
- I tbsp Louisiana hot sauce
- I I/4 tbsp lemon juice
- 1/2 tbsp liquid smoke

Instructions

- **Make sure you have your propane tank FULL for this one!
- I. Heat grill to medium.
- 2. Open can of beer with can opener, pour $\frac{1}{2}$ the beer from the can into a container and set aside. Place the can into cavity of chicken as shown. * I like to double the recipe and cook 2

chickens at once. This recipe is so good, we like to have leftovers. You will see what I mean when you try it!

- 3. Place chicken in a deep aluminum roaster pan and place onto grill. Close BBQ lid and cook for 45 minutes.
 - 4. Combine all BBQ sauce ingredients in sauce pan, then baste generously on chicken.
 - 5. Allow chicken to cook for remaining 45 minutes.
 - Meanwhile, simmer the remaining ingredients in saucepan on stove for 20 minutes, until reduced by half the volume.
 - 7. Remove chicken from BBQ and slice. Serve chicken with remaining BBQ sauce, as desired.

Notes

- You'll need to keep the grill going for up to 1.5 hrs; make sure you have extra propane or are filled up!
- Your grill will need to be high enough to close over an upright chicken test it first!
- It is very difficult to get a nutritional analysis with this recipe. This nutritional analysis assumes that you use ALL the BBQ sauce and that it stays on the chicken. (My family only used about 1/3 of it for 4 of us and much bakes off in a 1.5 hr cooking period) The calorie count and fat content per portion is reduced by using less BBQ sauce as well.

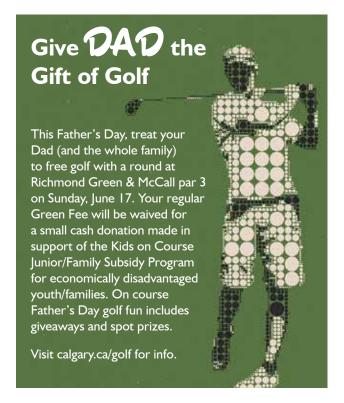
