

BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS FOR FAMILIES Lorna Selig, , Personal Safety and Self Defense Facilitator

The start of the new school year brings about many emotions, fears, and excitements for families. Make sure your children start the year off right with these strategies for personal safety.

Teaching your child about safety is not intended to scare them, but rather prepare them so they are alert, confident and able to manage an unfamiliar situation. Think of it this way; which spelling test is your child better prepared for... the one they have studied for or the one they have not?

- Ensure your child walks to school or the bus with someone else. Safety in numbers still rings true!
- Walk the route to school or the bus with your child a few times before school starts. Help your child identify places they could go if they need help.
- 3. Make sure your child knows your full name and phone number and theirs.
- Do not put your child's name on their backpack. Instead, put their name and phone number inside, where its not visible to
- 5. Teach your child to walk with confidence; head up, looking around for people or situations that maybe risky. Making eye contact also implies confidence.
- Discuss intuition and instinct. Remind your child that they can stay out of harms way by noticing these 'Chilly Willies or Creepy Vibes' and leaving the area to seek help from a trusted adult.
- 7. Teach your children the "Safety Cheer": NO, GO, YELL, TELL. Practice it with them and remind them to shout it loudly to let people know they need help.
- 8. Create a Family Password with your children. If someone tries to entice your child to go with them, have your child ask for the family password. If the person does not know the password, instruct your child to not go with them, but to run back into the school or to find help immediately.
- 9. Arrange for a SafeNeighbor. Near your home or school who can be a safe person for your child.
- 10. Along with the exciting activities they will be eager to share with you, teach your child to always communicate any unsafe or worrisome events that may have happened in their day.

The City of Calgary Recreation is happy to announce that a new skatepark was awarded to Bowness, and it will be located in Queen Elizabeth Park at 4324 77 St. N.W. The City would like to acknowledge the support from the Bowness Community Association, the Bowness Legion #238, the local branch of the Boys & Girls Club of Calgary and Councillor Ward Sutherland. Ward is pleased that he was able to help bring this much anticipated community amenity to the youth of Bowness.

Being sensitive to the location and its significance in the community, The City engaged the Local Legion #238 and received their endorsement of the skatepark. The design of the skatepark will complement the historic relevance of Queen Elizabeth Park and have design elements that honour our veterans. It will also incorporate what was heard during The City's 2014 and 2016 participatory design sessions.

Construction of the Bowness skate spot will begin in late September or early October 2018. This park will take 12 weeks to construct and is anticipated to be complete and open to the public by January of 2019. Seasonal deficiency work, such as landscaping, will be completed at this site in the spring of 2019.

City liaisons will continue to work with the community stakeholder groups to support the development of the park, the public art program delivery, and are planning for grand opening

ceremonies to be held in 2019.

We want to thank the community volunteers and supporters for their time an effort to bring this project into the Bowness Community.



A message from Pat Kelly



I am committed to assisting constituents when dealing with federal departments and agencies. Examples include Canada Revenue Agency, Department of Veterans

Affairs, Citizenship and Immigration, Employment Insurance, and the Canadian Pension Plan.

If your concern is with a federal agency, first try to resolve the problem with the department yourself. Contact them with your issue, and once you have received a response, contact my office if you would like my staff to advocate for you.

My office provides Canadian flags (large and small) and lapel pins to constituents, schools, and community groups. There is a limited supply, but usually enough to fill reasonable requests.

If you or a local organization you are connected with would like to extend an invitation to an event, please contact my Calgary office with the details, and I will attend if my schedule allows.

Some of the issues we have been dealing with in Ottawa this session include the Trans Mountain Expansion Project, Budget 2018, Democratic Reform, NAFTA, Illegal Border Crossers, and concerns around what the Carbon Tax will actually cost Canadians.

Please feel welcome to contact me with concerns related to federal policy any time. The feedback I receive from constituents is highly valued, and helps me to gauge how constituents in the riding feel about matters which are under federal jurisdiction.

DIETARY NEEDS CHANGE WITH AGING
